An overview analysis of published EITI Reports and emerging issues

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Tangible progress of EITI implementation by EITI Reports being published in many countries

- EITI has come a long way since inception
- Approximately 11 countries have published one or more EITI Reports (Liberia EITI Report, issued this week, is the latest)
- These EITI Reports have in themselves begun to have an impact in these EITI countries:
 - ✓ often first time that revenue data is in public domain or one place
- ✓ published Reports have generated debate among citizens, NGOs
- ✓ have shown that collaborative EITI processes can and do work in these countries – esp. agreement on scope/depth of EITI Report

A few issues stand out from this analysis ...

- EITI reports vary considerably in scope of coverage and nature/degree of disclosures - depending on the country
- YET is in line with a **basic pillar of the EITI framework - a global minimum standard to apply locally per country circumstances**
- Other key observations too from this comparative analysis:
 - ✓ varying follow-up treatment of discrepancies identified in Reports
 - ✓ disaggregation by company not always the case (although disaggregation by payment type is almost the norm)
 - ✓ presentation of the revenue and payments data is not always user-friendly in a way that non-specialists can easily understand

Hence emerging policy issues for debate

- In line with EITI policy framework, EITI Reports do vary in scope in light of country circumstances and nature of sector financial flows
 - Is there a need for more consistency – and hence guidance on “core reporting standards” as applied by implementing countries?
- EITI Reports show which reporting companies are included but may not always show what companies are not included
 - Is there a need for all EITI Reports to disclose all companies (or categories of companies) which have not reported – and why?
- Also, other issues raised at a 2008 workshop of Administrators / Audit firms (convened by World Bank and EITI Secretariat)
 - See next slide for purpose and key outcomes of this workshop

Highlights of issues raised at workshop for EITI Administrators / audit firms held in 2008

- The purpose of the workshop was to :
 - ✓ be a forum to convene EITI practitioners to discuss on recurrent issues arising in their EITI reconciliation / audit work for countries and multi stakeholder working groups (MSWG)
 - ✓ prioritise such issues to enable follow-up policy actions/ guidance
- Major recurrent issues discussed (as experienced by the firms):
 - ✓ expectation gaps between scope of work agreed for the EITI Report - and what stakeholders / MSWG expect from the Report
 - ✓ need for more dialogue between Administrators and stakeholders to minimize these expectation gaps (as to what agreed reconciliation / audit can and cannot accomplish in a EITI report)
 - ✓ need to find ways to improve quality of data submitted to Administrators by reporting companies and government agencies
