Honourable Minister.

As the Oil and Gas industry is going to become a very important resource in the economy, there is increasing global demand for greater transparency, prompting need for publication of Petroleum Contracts and Concessions in accordance with the Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (EITI) principles.

The case for publishing Petroleum Contracts and Concessions is premised on the global demand for public scrutiny of Petroleum Contracts by States, and providing an opportunity for Government and Companies to build public trust in the Oil and Gas Industry.
